It is now 6:30 o'clock. I finished supper and am free until 10:00 o'clock tonight.

Tomorrow I will be taking my I Q tests and get the injections. That's all the fellows say how here to a rookie, is "look out ^{for} the hook" (injections)

When I arrived at camp a fellow called my name out special I stepped out to find it was low, the fellow I was told you I was to meet.

It looks as if he is going to take care of me by giving me a good break.

He had me placed into a barrack which is much better than a tent.

I know I forgot
the crackers last night.
They would have come in
handy because we didn't
get into camp until 2 o'clock,
and I was stranded.

I may be here for
quite a while, so I think
you can write me here.

I hope you receive this
letter on Thursday.

I will call you at
8 o'clock.

fellows just remarked
that your picture looks
