My Sweetheart Dearest,

I'm answering your letter on the question you asked me about me receiving a furlough. I might have confused you by first telling you I probably won't then telling you I may get a leave. At the way things look now I think I will get a furlough at the completion of my training here. It is not definite. I gave you a pretty good picture yesterday of the business of a furlough.

But I'm repeating it again
to give you a clearer picture.

I would like to have you
come down to see me because
my furlough isn't definite.

But if it involves the necessary
of troubling your mother
then I think it would be
wiser to wait and hope,
if I don't get a furlough, that
at least I'll be shipped to a
camp somewhere in the
Eastern states. Then you could
visit me then.

Dearest I don't know
the day or week that I
will receive my leave.
It might be around
the middle of August.
Then if I should receive it
when I'm shipped to my
new camp I probably get
my leave in September.



I realize it must be very difficult for you to decide what to do. But as the sergeant told me you can only be sure of two things that's being payed sometime and eating three times a day.

my plans -

wait until I know if I get a furlough or ~~not~~ don't. If I don't then visit me at my next headquarters.

naturally I would like you to visit me either way because then I could be with you so much longer.
