I had ~~colored~~ a coke after are supper we had entertainment by the battalion orchestra and the ~~the~~ fellows.

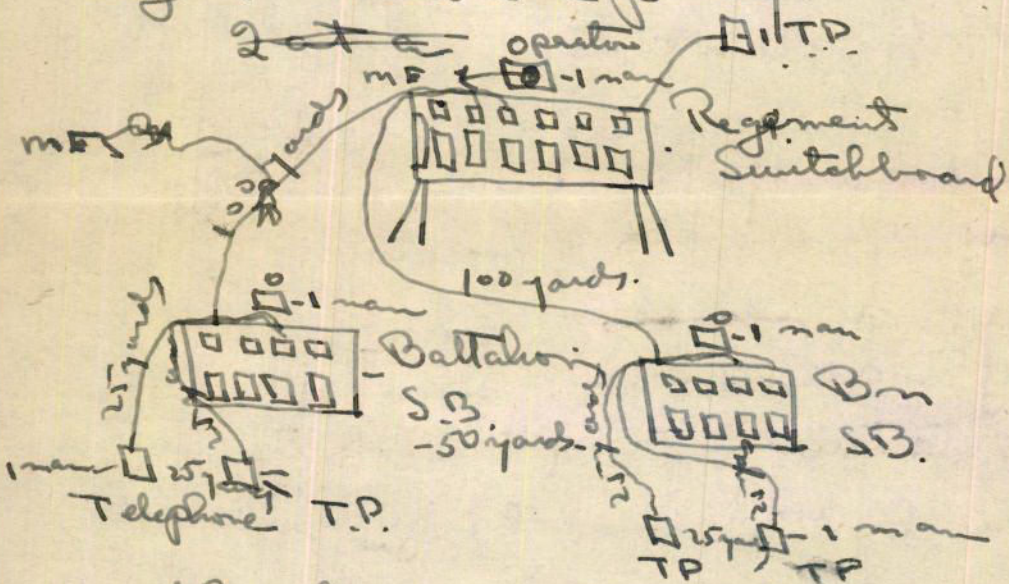
Also this evening we are having a dance at the Service Club for the 26th (my) battalion.

Today we had a nice practical problem in the switchboard. We had eight men to a party.



The above is the set up we had this afternoon. About 100 yards distance between switchboards.

There were two men each at each switchboard. And two men to lay the wire for communication between S.B. I was my buddies and I who ~~set~~ set up communication today. Later in the day we changed off and I worked on the regiment S.B.
