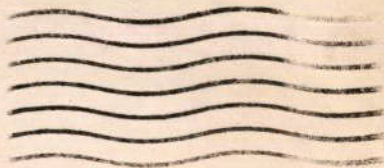

My Deary Beloved Judy,

One month from today I expect, and hope I'll be on my way home to see you. August 20, I complete all my training at this camp then as I hear I'll get my furlough starting on Monday but probable be able to start home on Saturday evening because we are off on Sunday.

Only have a few minutes because I'm going on a hike soon.

Just received your Monday letter and I'll try and answer it as much as time permits me.

Darling I don't feel bad that you attend the USO. Infact as mentioned

before I think that it a very good idea because it offers you a place to enjoy yourself and keeps you occupied.

Sorry I was unable to Thursday complete this letter yesterday but before I knew it I had to fall out. You are right problem

Getting back to where I left off yesterday, I understand you very clearly about the U.S.O. I agree with you 100 per cent. If it will please you I'll try and enjoy myself but it can't compare with being with you dear.

About two weeks before I get my furlough I should know definitely the date of my leave because I'll have to fill a furlough (type) papers out. ~~Give~~ This should give you enough time (I hope) to arrange with your office your vacation period.

Just had mail call and I received
your lovely letter of July 20,

and Allen. The snapshots are
certainly excellent pictures.

I appreciate the thought of
wanting to send me some reading
matter but honestly darling, I
something wonder how I manage

Now I'm writing between
chow time and waiting for my
next period. We have chow at
11:30 and our next period is at
12:30 - In between eating and
mail call I am writing you now
