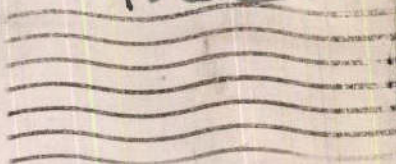

cartoon taken from "The Spartan"

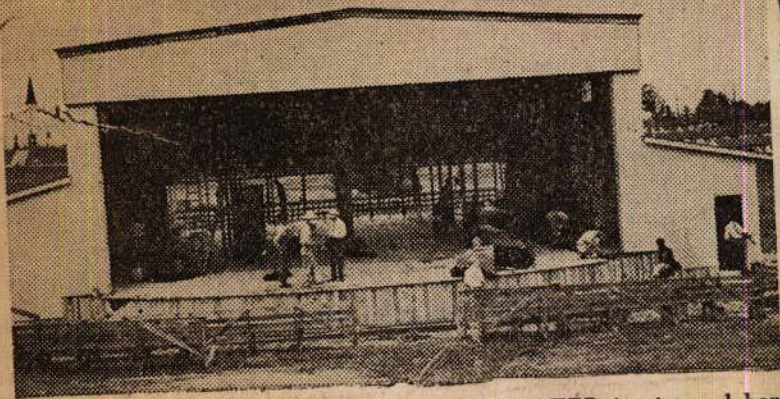
