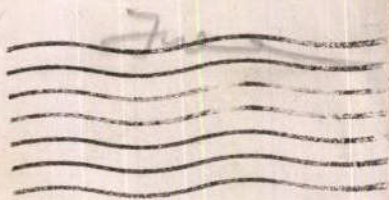

My Beloved Sweetheart,

I didn't receive any mail from you today but possible due to the fact you are in Long Beach. Looking forward till tomorrow when I hope to receive two letters from you.

Today was a easy day except that I'm tired from being in the sun all day. In the morning and in the afternoon we had basic training. It was tactics in squad movement. Most of the afternoon we had a discussion

with are instructed on how silly ~~the~~ this maneuver is. I'm not getting much training out of it. I only work with my battalion which is a specialized group in communication. On the other side of are known area is located another battalion that specializes in riflemen. Instead of working hand and hand we are working separately. We don't have the riflemen and they don't have communication. I understand my point altogether there are 12 different battalions of maneuvers each one working independently.

I believe I told you my schedule as far as maneuvers goes, but I'll





repeat it.

Scheduled to return back  
to camp Saturday at noon.  
Being back by truck so  
we won't have to wash,  
we then are going to get 28  
more hours of basic  
training and after that - I  
don't have to tell you because  
you should know what I'm  
going to say. Well I

as we were told we
