Dearest Judy,

By the time you receive this letter I think that the news I have to write will be old because I expect to be leaving here shortly, maybe Tuesday or Wednesday.

All the fellows from my group have left camp except those entering the Air Corp. Marty, your friend was correct when saying the boys would be going home on Sunday. Yes dear, it was last Sunday. They have to report to Fort Meade on September 17. Marty left Friday and he will be there



on Sept 20.

As far as I'm concerned  
my orders had to be changed  
because I wasn't here at  
the time. I expect to get my  
orders the early part of next  
week to report to Fort Meade.  
As for the furlough, there is a  
good possibility of getting  
another one when my  
orders comes through. You see  
the ~~emergency~~ emergency furlough  
doesn't go on my record and  
it doesn't count as a furlough.  
So dearest I may be home  
by the time you receive  
this letter.

I am now back at the  
VSO. There isn't much to  
do so maybe we (my buddies)  
will take in a movie or  
go bowling.



The weather down here is much cooler. In fact in the mornings we freeze. Last night I & sleep slept with two blankets over me.

Received your box of cookies and candy and I would like to thank you very much for them. They tasted so good and we all enjoyed eating the candy and cookies.

I'll probably ~~write~~ inform you as soon as possible on my new developments.

I'll telephone or send you a telegram letting you know as soon as I find out when I'm leaving and ~~to~~ where



I missed Marty on Friday.  
He left about 2 o'clock and  
I arrived in camp at 4:30 o'clock.  
Hope he calls you up.
