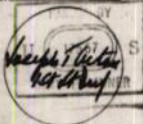

Just back from the PX after waiting two hours in line to get my weekly rations. I was able to buy, 5 bars of candy, 1 box of soap, 1 tube of tooth paste, writing pad, and five packages of cigarettes, which I give to the other fellows except for one pack. Since I came overseas, I started smoking lightly. Surprising? I wanted to buy a pipe but they were all sold out.

Darling, I don't no if you are receiving mail from me every day but I'm writing you daily. I can't write you U mail every day because I only receive a few sheets a week, I therefore plan on sending one at the beginning of the week and another during the week. This way you will hear from me sooner at least twice a week. The air mail possible takes longer but you should, with in time have a letter from me few every day in the year unless I write differently.

I'm still waiting anxiously for mail from you. Glad I have the last two letters from you that I last received at Camp Meade I read them over and over again.

That's about all I can write on this sheet so sweetheart, I'll close with all my love and thinking of you all the time. Ben
