Today I received three nice letters from you. I got the letter with the Red Army Signal enclosed, the last letter you mailed to me at Camp Craft. The other letters were dated Oct 21 and a V mail dated Oct 26th. That seems to be the first day you received mail from me since coming overseas.

You mentioned about knitting me a sweater. I didn't think or remember, that I was supposed to tell you to knit me a sweater. I probably could have used a sweater here due to the cool nights and dampness and you should start knitting me a sweater this letter. Another month for me to receive it, when it will be spring but I don't think I'm not going to stop you. I certainly would like to have a knitted sweater. I don't please don't send me a man-made sweater. If you intend sending me a sweater it must be knitted by you.

Last night I didn't have ice cream we did go to the show. I was at the Red Cross playing ping pong.

Today the fellow and I played checkers in our tent with the set you sent me. Darling it's a lovely set. Thanks again for the gift package.

My watchman address has changed from the 33rd to the present 31st watchman. I'm still at the same camp. Dear take notice of my address return address.

That about all the room there is sweetheart, so I'll close as always with all my love & kisses.
