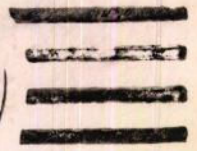

I'm sending you a regular letter today because I'm running short of U mail stationery and since I've been told that air mail and free mail take about the same time to arrive back in the States I'll try a free letter to see if that's correct. There isn't any sense of spending six cents for air mail when free will reach you at the same time. So dear kindly let me know. I asked you that question before but so far I haven't received anolt any of your letters stating if air mail is faster even though you probably answered that question.

There's probale many letters from you at the camp post office for me but its taking ~~some~~ extra time to distributed



the mail cause of all the moving 2  
around.

I'm now waiting for mail call and I hope by the time I finish this letter I'll receive a few letters so I'll be able to inform you about them. If not I'll tell you about them tomorrow (if I receive mail,) because I haven't much time to write today.

yes, I just received another letter from you which is only day tenday old. written on Nov-2!  
you see I mail is faster so dear please use more of I mail even if you have to use two sheets for the day. as, as us air mail is concerned - 9 out of 10 times it will arrive here at the same as regular letters.
