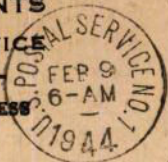


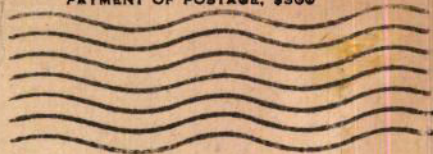

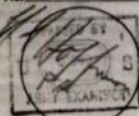

It appears as if the final phases in the Italian campaign are coming to a head, and just as it was stated the allies would be in Rome by spring. I think we will be in there much sooner, but only time can tell.

The book that was sent me "The Seventh Cross" looks to be a good reading book, and from reports I gotten from someone who read it said the book is excellent. Darling, I don't want you to send me such expensive books, just in fact you are thinking about it. I now have enough reading matter for some time. Only send me pocket books if you must send me something.
