

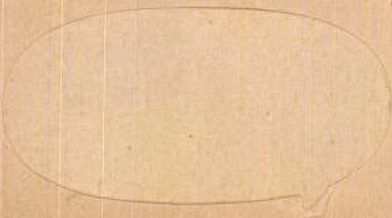

your v-mail letter of March 20th arrived today.

That clipping from the newspaper explains about the planes but that doesn't <sup>need</sup> any means that I was at that place because that offer applied to all P.K. stores and besides the boys were <sup>even</sup> able to order even at the front.

Yesterday party it was like old times because at the Red Cross in town they served ice cream with donuts. Remember the time in the Automat I made that combination. The Red Cross building in town is nice, there are tables and chairs and for five cents a gassy Italian waitress serves coffee and excellent cake, some of the boys go to play.

There really isn't anything being in the city, but the atmosphere is different what being in camp and the majority of fellows like to do and get drunk but I just can't see it. I don't mind drinking a little but when it comes to excess I don't like it and I don't.

A letter from your cousin Shesby informed me that her brother George who was on his way overseas is now stationed in England. She says I won't be getting the chance to see him.

Give my regards to Nancy even though I only saw her once.
