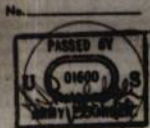

My Dear, I closed Judy,

I took one roll of pictures today and now the problem is to get them developed.

One picture was taken of me sitting at the switchboard. I hope it won't be censored and it comes out good. Other pictures were taken of the gang from my tent and then of Al and I.

I went down to the PX store to have the pictures developed, only to be disappointed and told that they weren't taking any pictures for five days. It would be the army if I didn't have to wait.

Today wasn't a complete failure as I got the opportunity and saw the same Broadway production of the stage show of "This Is The Army". Even Irving Berlin sang his old favorite song then introduced a new song written for my army. Did you hear it yet? The show was similar to the movie picture and I really enjoyed it but I haven't much better it would be to be seeing the show with you sitting next to me. I have the program and in my next letter I'll enclose it.

There wasn't any mail today because the post office moved but tomorrow that will be a double amount of letters and I hope it applies due with receiving mail from you about. No room for all the fat night former
