Nov 12, 1944

My beloved Darling,

It was snowing during the
night and now the terrain is
covered like a white sheet.

I received another air mail
letter from you today dear dated
Oct 25th.

So you enjoyed reading the
news paper "Beachhead News" I would
like to send you additional copies
but it's impossible because it
won't pass censorship, you see
the copy I mailed you was a
special souvenir edition printed
for the purpose of mailing home.
The ordinary daily edition of
the news paper contains vital
news to the enemy as its stories
goes into detail as to telling us
which company or division, attached
such and such a post, you
read the stories in the home
town papers but without telling
the exact location and division
attaching. a few days after the
operation it might appear in
the news papers back home.

we released after VE day. That's
Victory, European day.

I'm surprised that the negatives
I developed, the prints came out okay.
Wasn't there many scratches on
the prints? I'll appreciate if you
send me the prints of each picture
so I can see how they came
out.

I think of tall fellow in one
picture is a fellow from Michigan
who drives one of the half track
vehicles.

I agree with you that what
our intentions ^{of doing} with
Germany should be openly
discussed ^{until} after we completed our
main task. I do believe
that it's important for the leaders
of the allies ^{countries} to know now
what they intend to do with
Germany after they ^{it is} defeated,
so that they can ^{put} their
plan into operation immediately.
If the leaders discuss their plans
after Germany is defeated that
many conflicts may arise.

Back in Italy my outfit
supported many of the famous divisions
you probably heard where here.
I can't answer your question as to
what division my outfit is attached
to now but you probably know
by now because I sent you a
I mail Christmas and New Year
greeting cards and you will find
your answer there.

Read in the Stars and Stripes
about who are entitled to the battle
stars I send you one, which must
be placed on the overseas ribbon.
I'll be getting three more stars.
The star I sent you was for the
campaign of Southern Italy. The
W.D. is issuing another one for
the battle above Rome, then one
for Southern France, and the
fourth battle star will be for
the present campaign. I haven't
received the stars thus far but
eventually I will. If you don't
know, each campaign star
will be points in the demobilization
plans. In order words it's a factor
in determining which men will
