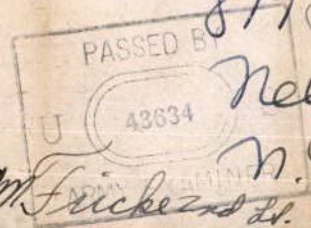

My Dearly. I closed

former Colonel wrote about the 93 A.F.A. Co.
I wanted to see send you the booklet
clear every since I received it but
as you know I was unable to.
I stayed here and had better luck
therefore its on its way to you
now. I know you will enjoy
reading the brief experiences of my
former outfit. Also sent the other
copy to Mother plus a pair of
German binoculars that I obtained
back in Italy but then I was
unable to send the binoculars home.
The cover or frame of the binoculars
is very worn but the most important
part, the lenses are in excellent
condition. I haven't any use for
the binoculars over here and instead
of continuing to carry it around
with me I decided it would be

wiser to send it home as it will
be useful in the future.

When to the movies this evening
dearest to see a good picture, titled
"and Now Tomorrow". It's suppose to
be a fairly recent picture. About
time a new picture was shown.

Received two more welcomed

dated Jan 26th.
