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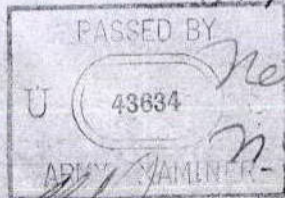

Luckily I'm able to write you another letter today dear and besides I received a few letters from you. Your 4 mail letters are dated March 16th, 18th, 20th and 23th plus two of your special letters, air mail dated March 10th and 25th. The latter letter arrived in excellent time.

Congratulations on your increase in salary. It is kind of a big jump but no doubt you well deserve it for the responsible job that you have. That now adds something else for us to celebrate. Thanks for the candy that's on its way. I'll have to eat double the amount of candy, one for myself and the other that you would be taking from the box.

It looks hopeless of seeing Howie again at least for awhile, even though he is in the same division as I'm in. He is so far behind me that it isn't funny.

This time I'll have to forgive you for your remark that I don't look under the stamps to attempt to figure out what you have written. But don't let it happen again.

Got a kick out of you saying again about the constitution stating, they couldn't take personal property, because I clearly remember you after say it and right now I can just visualize the sweet way you made that statement.

How can I forget those Saturday evenings when we use to listen to the Hit Parade.

I completely forgot about a Seder until you mentioned it in your letter received today plus a letter from Mom asking if I was able to attend a Seder this year similar to the one I attended last year in Italy. Because of the speed of our armies arrangement couldn't be held for the holiday services possible next year I'll be able to make up for it by attending both the first and second nights of the Seder.

I'm beginning to get a broader view on the German civilians after I have spoken to a few civilians from Poland and Russia. In the town I'm billeted now it reminds me of New York as it has all types of nationalities. Sure the German civilians want the war to end quickly now, that
