Yesterday it was moving day for us. You know how busy one gets moving from one place to another back home, it was the same way here. It was a sudden move as it was expected because we were out of boundary of our Army sector. We traveled about fifty odd miles South. I don't know the name of this town but I'll inform you in the tomorrow's letter.

The set up is very nice as my platoon is situated in a large house and my squad as two rooms for itself with beds, plus a nice writing table that I'm using at present. There is a place to go swimming nearby, but since I haven't seen the place I can't give you any report on it. Since we moved again it means more work, as we have to straighten out our quarters plus fix and arrange things here and there. Oh what a job but really it isn't so terrible as there isn't anything else to do as yet.

I'm not using the typewriter because a few of the fellows are already sleeping and the typewriter would make too much noise. We have electric lights and water both of which were out of order a few days ago but repairs were made putting them in order yesterday.

The town I'm in is not a large one but it seems to be a cozy town, clean, with mostly modern small homes.

There wasn't any mail from you today darling just another small package from mom. Your package when quickly, naturally will all the good contents you selected.

I think I'll go to bed now to dream to think of you and those wonderful moments I'm looking forward to with you.
