Today I consider a splendid day in that I received three lovely letters from you. One a V mail letter dated May 25 and two air mail letters dated May 26 and 29

Dont you worry Ill collect that big kiss plus many more I hope for that big one stripe promotion.

I think you gave me the best advice on the deficiency of the typewriter when you said h that I should get a new machine. I know for a fact that it isnt my fault because I c an press the key real hard and then keep starting at it without seeing the typewriter budge.

Think you got something their, about sending me home for a furlough than returning here as occupation instead of going to the Pacific. I would be greatly content but darling the Army doesnt look at it the way you do. Sure wish they did. I have to be satisfied with the possibility of remaining here at least until the Pacific war is finished. Actually honey if I do remain here, which Im still in doubt about, I cant afford to complain while the other fellows will be going through hell once again .

Just occurred to me that I may have the fault

with this machine which really is my own fault. I do do not release my finger quick enough in order for the machine to skip. Remember you suggested that I hit the keys harder but now that I'm doing it softly I'm getting better results but not quite perfect.

Send the roll of film in to be developed and within a few days I should be getting them back. Here's hoping the prints come out good.
