My Beloved Judy,

The reason why this letter isn't typewritten is because I'm now writing you while on guard. Since many of my hours are now spent on guard, I haven't very much time for writing you when I'm in my quarters.

I'm posted in a village about fifteen miles from where we are billeted. Two men go on one post together, and we are the only American soldiers here now.

It's kind of stupid to be posted where I am because there isn't any excitement at all. Nothing ever happens. We are posted here cause of the German Army concentration area, which is suppose to be off limits to civilians



but we permit the cumbars  
to leave and enter the village  
as they go to work in the fields.

Do you recognize this writing  
paper honey? Yes your sweet  
package arrived today, but I  
haven't eaten the delicious chocolates  
yet as I received two packages  
yesterday that I want to finish  
first.

Thanks for the roll of film  
honey, and your request for snap shots  
has already been fulfilled, any day  
now I'm expecting a letter from  
you, saying that you received  
the pictures I mailed you. I'll  
use this roll of film when I'm  
able to snap a few interesting  
pictures, can't understand why the film  
wasn't in its box, any special  
reason for it?

film darling, but for the  
complete package which I greatly  
appreciate.
