My Dearest Judy,

Today I received your air mail letter dated June 28th.

I imagine that you mean that you met Frank Bernstein . Instead of him enlightening you with news it must have been you this time. Writing of Julie I also received a letter from him today and it appears as if he isnt slated to return home immediately. Julie wrote that he is now assigned to the 7th Army and within two weeks he expects to be quartered in Munich or possible Augsburg. The latter city is the one that I was formally stationed at. Once Julie arrives at his new quarters Im sure that Sam Julie and myself will be able to have a grand reunion. Julie is still under the impression that Im still in Augsburg as I probable havent written him yet of my new address but Ill do so pronto. So long as Sam remains at his present location Julie shouldnt have any difficulty locating him and from their Sam knows where to contact me. Thats just the way Sam and I planned it when I saw Sam last Sunday and Julie seems to have to same idea in mine.

Another small group of men have left my company. This being the lucky fellows as they all have over 90 points and are slated to fly home in a few days . Now they are on their way to Paris and from their a air-

craft will fly them home in about 19 hours. By the end of next week they probable will be out of their brown uniforms and wearing civilianx clothing once again. The change certainly is rapid and if it was to happen to me Ill be to much shocked in the quick change . What the difference I still have a long time to think of that occuring to me.

yes, sweet heart I realize that its been a very long time that we haven't seen each other, but my love for you has continued to go on, and I constantly miss you every day, in every way.
