Went to see the Jack Benny show today and we had to travel about thirty miles to see him. The show was good and I especially enjoyed the singing on Martha Tilton, the famous and popular singer. I got a very close up view of the stars even though there were a few thousands troops. As soon as the show started I eased myself up to the front so that I could snap a few pictures. I got so close that the only place I could find a spot was under the stage and that's where I was, seeing the show. I took a few pictures but I don't expect them to come out good cause of the awkward position I was in and the sun directly in line of my shooting.

The surprising event of the day was meeting a fellow from my old outfit, that's the 93ABA. They happen to be stationed in the same city as the Jack Benny show. I've talk to many of the boys that were in my battery. Now the outfit is slated to return to France in about a week and then proceed home. All the fellows with under 78 points have already left the outfit and been replaced with men with over 85 points.



Quite a few of the fellows have eighty two to eighty four points and they are sweating it out, cause if the points went lowered before the outfit returns to France then they also will have to be transferred to another outfit. Naturally coming over with the unit they would like to return home with it.

My present company is does not have as much guard duty as my former outfit had as thus for the only guard here is the company guard. We havent any installations to guard over and I hope the outfit isnt assigned any for a long time.
