at noon today I received a over night pass to return to my former company, and hats from where I'm writing to you now. The trip was very profitable honey for I saw the mail clerk, and he had four swell letters from you dated July 17th, 18th, 19th & 20th. So, the mail clerk wasn't forwarding my mail yet because he didn't know what company I was assigned to.

Another mission that I accomplished was to go over and see the carpenter, who as yet, hasn't completed the job but its in its final stages. Before I leave tomorrow I'll have the item as by then it will be completed.

Regret to hear that its been raining so constantly lately and spoiling your evenings out at the beach, I hope by now cheri has been a bit up.

I don't know how good the deal would have been if I went to division quartermaster, but I imagine it would

have been nice. Just as well that I didn't have an opportunity to find out.

Since the non-fraternization policy has been lifted I haven't noticed any change in an attitude of the union. Even before, the law was not ^{very} much enforced.

Tonight I'll be sleeping in the same bed that I occupied before I went to the 1st A division. A few of the fellows went to the movies but I'll remain with the remainder of the boys, and have our regular bull session. Quite a few of the boys that transferred when I did, returned today.

Good night my darling, and sleep well. I love you with all my heart and I will forever, I constantly miss you, every day, in every way.
