Tomorrow is the day that we move. We have to get up at 3:30 in the morning and at 5:30 we start moving out to our new location. The trip is expected to take the entire day. No mail is going out today honey and it probable wont be before Monday that mail service is resumed but I did manage to receive today your special letter of July 28th.

Why its shocking that you finally received from Jack the photo that you gave him of me to have enlarged. Now you learnt your lesson better not give away any more snaphots to Jack.

Regret to here of the rainy weather that you are having and spoiling your weekend vacations. After a hard weeks work Ill imagine that you would be looking forward to spending an enjoyable weekend. Over here its been the same way durning the past few days, but this afternoon it looks as if it might clear up. I especially hope so for its miserable traveling in the rain.

The news that the Allies have accepted Japans peace terms providing that an Allie commander rules over the Emperer has us all excited as this may mean the end of world war two. If the war is to end shortly than I dont know the immediate plans of what will happen to us remaining here as occupation. All I know is that I want to quickly return to you dear ,put into effect our dreams,hopes and plans .

Have to rise early darling cherefore I'm going to go to bed early so Ill still get my usual time of dreaming of you, Goodnight, and pleasant dreams to your dearest, I love you with all my heart and miss you more than words can express
