Returned to Paris again this afternoon and going to spend the rest of the afternoon here at the hotel and thus far we haven't got any thing planned for this evening.

The latest developments around camp is that all men with 80 and above points, are restricted to the camp area as they are expected to ship out the 22nd, 23rd and 24th of this month. There the units at the camp will be reshuffled to sort the men in under 80 points, from a few of the outfits and place them in other outfits in the camp. It isn't expected that us men below 80 points will ship to a different

camp but rather remain at camp St. Louis until we are called. That might be in two weeks or two months, more likely the latter.

Last night I went to the camp theatre to see "Along Came Jones" which was just a passable movie.

Sweetheart, at one time I thought that by this day we would be united, but yet I see we still are as much separated as we ever were. Naturally darling in my heart, you are as close as you ever were and regardless of the waiting period, nothing will change that.
