This is my second letter to you today, I doubt if the first one will reach you. I wrote the other letter from the tent, and then left it on the bed while we got a short physical examination. During that time, it started to rain with heavy winds, and when I returned to the tent your letter disappeared.

Today was suppose to be the day when my outfit was going to move to Camp Boston but now that has been cancelled until tomorrow morning.

My outfit is the only outfit left here at camp St. Louis as the other outfits, either sent to another assembly area camp or the unit consisting of 80 joint men and above when to a P.O.E.

So now tomorrow is the day for us  
to move, but if we don't I won't be  
disappointed.

I was hoping for a few letters from  
you today honey since a few of the other  
fellows received recently dated letters from  
home, but my hope was not fulfilled.

I understand from the Star and Stripes, that  
the home going mail has been delayed  
two to three weeks till now, but now, the  
air mail letters will be going by airplane  
once again, therefore if you haven't been  
getting my mail regularly, you understand and  
there should be an improvement.
