Here I am again this time writing
you from Camp Boston. That's correct
we finally made the move this
afternoon.

From my quick spot check of the
camp, I can say that it's a immense
improvement over St. Louis. For one
the camp is winterized and now
we have twelve men in a much
larger tent, that has a cement floor
and tar and wooden sides, there also
is one stove and electric lights
in the tent.

I'm writing this letter from the
Service Club which is very nice and
has ample room for writing or

relaxing, reading a book or listening to the radio. Besides this place there are ARC clubs located throughout the camp. I haven't visited Chemnitz, for other recreation here are five large theatres located in the camp and later this evening I'm going to the second evening showing of "The Women in Green".

From the rumor department department we were informed informed that our outfit stands high priority in leaving here, since all the 80 pointers are suppose to be out of here, and my outfit is a 76 75 to 79 point unit. We were told a ready date, but darling, I won't pass that on to you, cause our original date was Sept 28th and you

The camp is kept spotless with the aid of the many German PW working around the area.
