hours from the time I left camp

With a new month, just one day off, I'm looking forward for big events next month, that should alter my present routine, as I should be in a further step in my returning home, and a additional step in my goal of returning to civilian life.

I made an easy 60 dollars, as I had 150 dollars in money orders and certain fellows are buying them for much more, cause they had an excess amount of money and the only way for them to safely get the money home is by money order, and one can not obtain a money order for more than they draw at the pay table.
