My Beloved Judy,

Well another Saturday is here and passing, without me being with you darling but I believe that this will be the last Saturday that I'll be writing you from this camp, and then it might not be many more Saturdays before our hopes and desires will be fulfilled.

Today has been just another dull routine day, except that the weather has been nice and fairly warm. This evening I'm going to the theatre to see "Our Vines Have Tender Grapes" which I hope is a good picture.

Oh yes, this morning we had an orientation on the government life insurance, and including

us to continue the policy in
military life. I haven't decided
what I'll do, cause it is expensive
though cheaper than any commercial
insurance policy. It would cost me
\$77.96 a year to carry the policy for
30 years, at 5,000 insurance but what
I don't like is that upon my death
the money would not be paid in
one lump sum but consequently in
small monthly installments of
twenty five dollars until the amount
of the policy has been paid. I have
upto eight years from the time I've
taken out my national life insurance
to decide if I want to convert,
providing that I pay the difference.
Have you any suggestions? or have
you heard any thing from a
reliable person as to whether or
not it pays to continue the government
insurance.
