This afternoon we had a battery formation informing us on our coming move to a P.O.E., as it stands now, we are scheduled to leave here anywhere from Nov-8th to 10th and we have been told for the first time that our destination will be the part of La Haie. Before we leave here we will have to have a physical examination, which ches for we haven't had. Therefore I doubt if we will move out on the 8th.

There wasn't any mail today honey and from what I understand from the mail clerk tomorrow will be the last day for incoming mail, therefore I hope I receive a few letters from you then, since I know that you been writing and I would like to receive your letters. When we leave here we will be traveling in 40 and 8th which will be a miserable trip, but ches is one time I won't mind, knowing that its one more step closer to home and you darling.

This is the last piece of writing paper at the Service Club, so, I'll have to finish my letter on this side.

Most of the day I spent here, playing ping pong. It's really the first time, since I'm away from home that I can remember devoting the entire afternoon to playing ping pong, but I like it, besides writing to you, dearest.

For this evening I plan on seeing the show, "Paris Underground" which is a recent picture.
