My Beloved Judy

This is it, unless there is a last minute change, which I doubt, we are prepared to move tomorrow to one of the La Hare camps. We had a quick physical examination today and an advance detail will be taking our duffle bags down to the train depot in about one hour.

We won't be getting a night's sleep cause we have to awake at 2 AM of all hours of the day.

I understand packing this does not mean that we will be embarking ~~on~~ aboard ship in a day or two cause once we reach the La Hare camp we are subject to remain there from forty eight hours up to ten days. I'll figure being there the maximum, if not longer, but I'll wish for the best.

No mail from you today dear, nor will I receive any for the next couple of days, when I arrive at the

La Hame camp I'll write you a letter relating the latest information. The distance from here to La Hame is not great, only 150 miles but tramping in boxcars may take much longer than if we went by vehicle.
