My Beloved Judy,

We arrived here today, at camp "Twenty Grand" and now we are on the last lap before embarking on a boat. The port of La Have is approximately twenty five miles from here.

I was speaking to a few of the fellows who have been here a few days and they relate that the average units remains here from five to ten days, so perhaps within ten days, I'll finally be headed on my way home.

I will know a day before our departure, the name of the ship I'll be on, therefore if possible I'll send you a

Cablegram them, informing you on what ship I'll be on, and how long the trip will take. Men are leaving here daily to go down to the port and embark on the ships. The majority of the boats are either of the Liberty or Victory type, therefore I expect I'll be on the ocean for an average of ten to twelve days.

A rumor already has floated around the battery, but since it's not official, just a good guess, I won't tell you of it, but wait until we get our official orders.

This camp also has a ARC from where I'm writing you from now, but the camp doesn't compare to the "Camp Boston".

for our first processing we are
converting all our French francs
for the good American greenbacks,
We won't receive our American
money until two to four hours
before we leave here, or maybe
while on the ship.

Packing that covers the latest
developments up till now, except that
as always I love you with all
my heart and Darling, I always
will.

Goodnight, and please + dreams
