

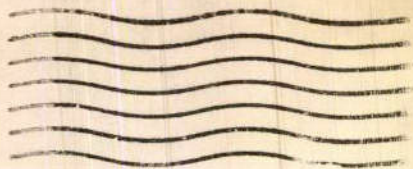

Dearest Judy,

I know you must be angry because you think I forgot to call you up on Thursday evening. On the ~~contrary~~ opposite I didn't forget. I was informed today that there are no know public telephone in which to call you. The officer had it discontinued because all the fellows were calling home when they found out there were being shipped out of this camp.

Today was a hectic day for me. In the morning I received my injections and complete army equipment. In the afternoon I took my I & Q examinations. After my final injection I felt dizzy and I had to

sit down, with my head  
bend over so that I won't  
faint. In a few minutes  
I felt much better.

If I remain at this  
Camp for 21 days then I can  
apply for a week-end pass.  
Most of the fellows are  
shipped out of here within  
seven days. I have my  
fingers crossed.

Darling, I changed my  
mind about not writing  
me here. you better  
write as soon as you  
get my address.

The Army gave me  
winter as well as summer  
clothing. Today I was in  
long woolen trousers and shirt.  
Can you picture me in  
those pants? Tomorrow I  
can change into summer  
underwear.

That's all the news  
today from the fighting front.
