Today I finished the processing. I got my interview in the morning and in the afternoon I saw pictures on the articles of war and a sex picture.

At the interview I was asked questions on the type of work that I did. He asked me if I knew how to type. I told him I could. Not knowing it, they gave me a typing test. My score was 20 words a minute. Maybe there will give me a typing job during my remaining days at this camp.

The daily program for me is as follows.

Up at 5.30 o'clock in the morning with my eyes half closed. Until 6.30 o'clock we clean up the bunk.

Then we go for show, at
7.30. clock we will go on detail
work, that's cleaning up around
camp. At 11.30. clock we have
chow again. In the afternoon
we have another detail
job. Tomorrow will be
the first day that I will
be going on detail work because
until now I was going
through ~~the~~ processing. At

4.30. clock we go for supper.
after that we are free until
10. clock when the lights go out.

There isn't much to do here.
All that I been doing is ~~and~~ walking
with the fellows and going to the
Post Exchange to get some ice cream.
As a whole it is very dull here
especially without you.
That's all for today.
